Declarations given to a public authority are given solemnly under penalty of perjury under the Danish "Act on the restriction of debtors' possibilities for participating in public invitations to tender and on the amendment of certain other acts" and the Danish Criminal Code.

The undersigned declares that the company has no unpaid, outstanding debt to a public authority in the form of taxes, duties or social security obligations exceeding DKK 100,000.

Guidelines.

According to the Danish "Act on the restriction of debtors' possibilities for participating in public invitations to tender and on the amendment of certain other acts",¹ tenderers must submit a declaration regarding the extent to which the tenderer has outstanding, unpaid debt to a public authority in the form of taxes, duties or social security obligations.

If the company has no outstanding debt exceeding DKK 100,000, the company must therefore complete and submit the above declaration together with the tender.

If the declaration is not submitted, or if the company's debt exceeds DKK 100,000, the contracting entity must not accept the tender. However, exceptions are possible, for example, if the tenderer has entered a repayment agreement and has abided by it, or can provide surety for the portion of the debt that exceeds DKK 100,000.
